

A View From The Box

Well here I go again! Looking back to 2017 the 1st XI had finished in the bottom half of the league for the 2nd consecutive season but balanced it with an adventurous Cup run. We needed to improve for the 2018 season.

The Committee started off the year by appointing Ben Saunders as Captain, an all-round Clubman, hoping for an exciting season ahead. Ben started by strengthening the squad by recruiting players. A return of wicketkeeper James McDonagh from Vernon Carus, Matt Shawcross from Glastonbury CC, Tom Jefferson from neighbours Blackpool CC and finally we welcomed Peter Buchanan from Australia, an inspiring coach with years of coaching experience.

First up on a sunny April afternoon was a trip to Wallasey. We won the toss and elected to bowl, and WHAT A START! Opening was Toby Lester who bowled a lovely straight one which rapped the batsman's pads. An instant cry from all 11 Lytham players of "Howzat!" and that magic finger of the umpire was raised. Wallasey were dismissed for 133, a fantastic start to the season. However, it wasn't meant to be, with Lytham losing narrowly by 2 runs.

Next up was Fulwood & Broughton in the National Knockout. A steady, unbeaten 52 from Tom Hessey saw us to a comfortable 8 wicket win and into the next round. With our first win under our belt, the lads were keen to keep the momentum. We hosted Rainhill. With overcast conditions, Ben elected to bowl which led us to dismissing them for just 69 - Lester, Mulligan and Holden sharing all 10 wickets. The following week saw Highfield bat 58 overs, leaving us not enough time to chase, match drawn.

Then came our first T20 of the season, a destructive 97 not out from Taylor Cornall against Hightown St Marys saw us cruise into the next round. Soon after was a weekend to forget with defeats to Champions, Ormskirk and neighbours Blackpool, ending our National Knockout hopes.

Another shock the following week, we crashed out in the 1st round of the Lancashire Cup against Palace Shield side Eccleston. This is would also be the theme in the coming weeks, heavy defeats from Bootle and Formby at Home, a League Cup exit against Northern...AGAIN! and a T20 exit against Southport & Birkdale...AGAIN! Things can only get better!

Next up in the League was New Brighton, a team that were struggling to register a win. A quality all-round performance saw us crush them by 9 wickets. In action once again we



hosted League leaders, Northern the week after. With wet conditions Northern won the toss and elected to bowl. With a solid knock of 78 from Steven Croft, we were all out for 175 in 46 overs. A superb bowling and fielding performance saw us bowl them out for 97:- My personal favourite of the season. Followed by 2 great wins came great weather! We made the short trip to Rainford on one of Lytham's busiest days of the year, Club Day. Ben won the toss and elected to bowl. They amassed 243-5 off 55 overs. Some solid batting performances saw us win narrowly by 2 wickets. A Great Game!

Another High-Scoring game was picked up the week after against Leigh at Church Road. In scorching hot conditions Leigh won the toss and elected to bat. They posted 291-6. We made a fantastic effort with a great 3rd wicket partnership of 156 from Taylor Cornall (104) and Tom Jefferson (80) but fell short by 16 runs with 7 wickets down. Our good run of form ended with a defeat to Ormskirk, always a tough place to go and a defeat to Rainhill soon after.

On Saturday 4th August, Colwyn Bay made the "short trip" to Church Road. The away side won the toss and elected to bowl, we amassed 220-8 off 58 overs. A solid knock of 58 from Josh Holden and a blistering 60 not out from Ben. A superb bowling performance saw us skittle them for 69! Sharing the wickets were the Saunders brothers, Holden and Croft.

The end of the season was nearing and out of a possible 100 points, we accumulated only 29 - 15 of which were matches

abandoned. On Saturday 1st September we travelled to Northern on a day where a win would see them as league champions. Northern won the toss and elected to bat and had posted 236-8. In reply we got off to a good start, 42-0, but a soon collapsed to 80-7. In to the crease came, who I thought was Toby Lester. Half way through his crunching innings I realised that it was our skipper!! Oops!! Sorry Ben! A superb 8th wicket partnership of 106 between Ben (86) and Matt Taaffe (47) got us into a better position. However, the game ended in a nail-biting draw...phew! This mistake also led me to wearing "The Suit" as punishment! Cheers Lads!

Last game was now here, away to Leigh. In wet conditions. Leigh won the toss and surprisingly elected to bat. They had posted 190-8. With a steady knock of 32 not out from Tom Jefferson we saw the game out with a narrow 2 wicket win, finishing the season off on a high. A special mention to Ben who claimed yet another hat-trick in his career, all of which were LBWs! The league petered out and we finished in a better position than we did in 2017. Overall some better league performances but disappointing early cup exits. Going into my 9th season at this great club, here's to a better 2019!

A challenging season

The 2018 season was quite the rollercoaster for the 2nd XI, starting with a fantastic 5 wicket win at Church Road against a strong Northern side. This included the 2nd XI's performance of the year award by Jack Henriques with figures of 7-23 from 10.3 overs.

The following six fixtures saw us collect only 29 points. With two of those fixtures we struggled to score more than 60 runs. That said, against Orrell Red Triangle CC, we set them 210 to see them make no effort to chase down the target. The week prior to that, we just fell short of chasing down Wigan's 155 after being 68-8. Young Callum Doyle and I put on 77 from 10 overs leaving us 9 runs short. Seven games into the season with only one win and three draws, it was looking guite bleak for the 2nd XI with a lot of the senior members of the team anticipating a long challenging season.

June 9th saw us welcome fellow strugglers Ainsdale CC. Phil Watkinson, who was captain at the time, was unavailable and he asked me to stand in that weekend in a must win game, no pressure Ryan! I won the toss and made the bold decision to bat first going for the maximum 25 points. Myles Child (59), Jason McGreehin (58) and myself (52) saw the 2nd XI post 209-8 from only 38 overs. With intentions of strictly winning the game and the current points tally in the league table, I felt it best to not give Ainsdale the opportunity to pick up 5 bowling points and declared before tea. This gave us 40 minutes before tea to bowl at Ainsdale which I saw as a key opportunity to pick up a couple of wickets. We managed to bowl 11 overs before tea, Ainsdale 36-0. We bowled well with no reward. A change at both ends I felt was needed after tea; Peter Burn and I were the changes. Peter got the breakthrough and then at the other end I got the other opener out. Peter continued to bowl very tight however the number four took a liking to my bowling and slapped me for 22 in one over, without any hesitation I was off. I looked around at the options as to who I could bring on: - Morgan Davies, a much slower bowler of leg-spin. I felt that the opposition would look to target him. Quite the opposite happened with Morgan finishing with 1-9 from 7 overs. He really frustrated the Ainsdale batsman who then decided to target Peter Burn instead, bad idea! Peter finished with tremendous figures of 4-10 from 10 overs. We won, happy faces all round, 25 Points and out of the relegation zone... For now!

The following week saw us travel to Bootle CC. I was unavailable for this fixture nevertheless I kept in touch with the lads to see how the game was proceeding. Two great knocks from Josh Eales (82) and Phil



Watkinson (90*) not to forget a guick fire unbeaten 32 from just 18 balls from Joe Davies saw Lytham post 241-4. Bootle from 40 overs never really showed any intention of chasing the target down and finished 133-4. Disappointing end to a great first half display from Lytham.

Two weeks later we made the short journey to New Brighton CC, also struggling at the foot of the table. Phil won the toss and elected to bat. I think that was the biggest cheer of the day with the expected temperature to reach mid-high 30's. The whole outfield was basically straw. The heat wave that the country has endured leading up the game was evident and I'm confident to say nobody saw one green blade of grass that day. An aggressive approach from the lads saw us post a challenging 231-6 from only 39 overs. New Brighton knew they had to come out and win. Exactly how cricket should be played! The game was evenly balanced with NB 154-3 with the last hour being called. Phil turned to Dan Yates and me, the bowlers who had shared the 3 wickets. A fantastic spell from Dan Yates, controlled, aggressive, quick and accurate, saw Dan finish with figures of 7-70 from 17 overs, in blistering heat. Very well done Dan Yates! NB 206 all out. A massive 25 points!

The following weekend we had two games at church Road, the first saw the 2nd XI fall just 2 runs short of chasing down Wallasey's 217. Lytham finishing 215-7 with performances of note:- Joe Davies (62) and Kyle Macaulay (46). Great effort lads!

The day after saw us play New Brighton in the guarter final of the Chester cup at home. A fantastic knock from Joe Davies (99) and two great contributions from Matthew Cartmell (42) and Phil Watkinson (36*) saw us post 256-8. NB never really got going. Everyone bowled very well and NB was all out for 126, performance to note Christopher Cartmell 4-29. Into the Semi-final draw!

The following week saw us narrowly lose to Southport & Birkdale on the final ball, defending 234, which included the batting performance of the year from Christopher Cartmell (101*) supported by Jason McGreehin finishing unbeaten on 53. This game led to a change in management for the 2nd XI. Phil Watkinson had given his all for the team and unfortunately it wasn't to be and Phil stepped down as 2nd XI captain. I was approached by the committee and asked if I would be happy take on the captaincy and see the team through to the end of the season, to which I accepted. My first four official games in charge were nothing to shout about. Away to Wigan was abandoned and we couldn't guite get the last wicket away to Formby to claim the victory. The following Sunday we were in the semi-final away to cup favourites Ormskirk, Unfortunately none of the lads turned up and we comfortably lost by 122 runs. However, we still had to keep our heads held high and concentrate on maintaining our Premier Division status.

In the weeks ahead, we had a rain affected draw against Sefton Park, a rather comfortable win over Ainsdale, thanks to another destructive knock from Joe Davies (71) and unfortunately another narrow loss to Orrell Red Triangle - we all set out to chase the target and marginally fell short by 20 runs. Next up, Bootle at home, quite the eventful game, we scored 259-5 from only 33.3 overs which was a run rate at an explosive 7.77. Performances to note were Matt Stevenson (79*) and Jason McGreehin (83). I'm confident to say that declaring after just 331/2 overs is something I can't imagine has happened very often in the Liverpool Comp, leaving the opposition, 40 minutes before lunch 90 minutes after, plus the last 20 overs. We bowled 58 overs, to see them not attempt to win the game from the first ball of their innings, Bootle finished 205-7. This would all but condemn them to relegation, with New Brighton above Bootle. More importantly, this

result saw us pick up 8 bonus points which confirmed our premier division status for the 2019 season.

Briefly looking back at last season, there are plenty of positives that, we as a team, can carry into this season. The likes of Alex Higham and Morgan Davies, pushing to cement a permanent place in the side and with the three or four new faces into the squad from other teams, I'm confident that a lot of the lads will be playing for there places in the two senior teams. Competition for places, I'm sure will bring out many more key performances and team results. So here we are now, with the season fast approaching. Four indoor net sessions in, the structure and intensity of training sessions has been great. There really does seem to be a lot of positivity around the squad. Great to see!

The main aspect of the game that I would encourage all of the lads to strive to improve on is fielding. Too many times in seasons gone by have we lost games due to our fielding,

it is after all the most important part of the game! Ben and I are keen to work on this at training, with help from David Cartmell. We're looking forward to having very well structured net sessions every single week. Part of this is will be discussing plans with one another, understanding our roles and identifying areas of where each individual wants to improve, working on them to build a competitive, exciting and great squad bond.

When growing up, my Dad never let my brother or I win at anything; we had to earn the right to win. This is the mentality that I will encourage in the 2nd XI this year. I'm confident that the XI that is selected every week will back this philosophy. With the talent that the squads have this year, with competition for places, I'm happy in the right conditions and circumstances to elect to bat first and go for 25 points every single week. As a team, and in comparison to the teams we faced last year, I'm sure that everyone will be disappointed if we finish in the bottom half, why shouldn't we be aiming to challenge



In a season of only four games we had 10 attempted fixtures with the opposition constantly rearranging at the last minute which was very frustrating to say the least!

Unfortunately this meant that the core of the U17 team were on a Rugby tour to the Antipodes for many of the fixtures. Thanks and well done to the U14's who not only stood up and played for the U17's but also the 3 rd XI which helped to generate a good team atmosphere – May it continue into 2019.

Sadly we managed to find ways to lose all our games. Had we played by the league rules, taking the points instead of rearranging the fixtures, we would have come 1st or 2nd in our league having played and lost 1 game! But the objective is to encourage and enable cricket to be played so with that in mind we put out a team and played the game!



Although the U17's are technically classed as juniors they make such a large contribution to senior cricket so it makes more sense for them to be presented with their awards at the Senior Presentation Evening. This year the awards were as follows:

Batting - Alex Higham with a total of 111 runs, double that of the next nearest player. A high score of 44 and an average of 27.75.





Poor Adam, our groundsman, was at his wits end trying to get the ground ready for the new season as well as keeping an eye on the contractors to make sure their machinery was not churning up the football pitch (when the weather allowed them to work of course). At one point Adam had to tow their van off the outfield as it was completely stuck in the mud!

Luckily, the weather improved and allowed the contractors to work. And we are very pleased with the end result.

We had an official opening of the nets on the 28th July, 2018. It was attended by special quest, Sally Melling, daughter of the late Ray Beesley who was a long-time member of the Club. Ray sadly passed away in 2017. He kindly left a bequest in his will, and I felt that we owed it to him to do something worthwhile with it.

Several years ago, a group of parents and I, formed a Junior Fundraising Committee, specifically to raise funds to buy equipment for the junior section. Over the years, we have raised over £10,000 from BBQ's, cake sales and tombola's. All of our boys have






