1st XI ~ 2016



The 2016 season had kicked off well before any cricket square had been cut, creases marked out and outfield been mowed, as meetings and negotiations were in process, well before Christmas 2015, to put pen to paper on our new signings for season.

As a result of all the hard work from those involved in the off season recruitment, we welcomed Toby Lester, Gary Knight, Matt Taaffe and Taylor Cornall at Lytham CC for our first match up against Leigh CC. Resulting in a well deserved draw against a strong Leigh line up.

The momentum was up and down like a 10 year old on a pogo stick with another 'good' draw against a very strong Formby, followed by some very close losses to New Brighton (losing in the second last over in a thriller), and falling short against Ormskirk by 18 runs. Until an eventual win against Colwyn Bay in round 5.

The points at the top of the table at this early stage in the season were very tight as expected and we sat only one good win away from leading the ladder. Spirits were still high.

With a great win against always title contenders Bootle, we were right up there competing with the best with our very young squad that had an average age of 23.5 (that's including our most experienced men in Joey Davies and Antony Mulligan \bot).

The next 3 rounds went as followed- A convincing win against Birkenhead. A game we should have won against Northern and a very nervous draw against Wallasey where victory ended up being only 1 run away. The boys were still positive.

A familiar pattern in our performances then started to take shape. As the old saying goes, 'So close, but yet, so far away'. We were exactly that and as a result we were slipping down that greasy pole in the ladder.

Games that we were all but ruled out of a chance of winning- we won. And losses to teams that were in consideration for relegation for the 2017 season (Birkinhead Park, Colwyn Bay) who we had convincingly beaten in the first rounds of the season.

Another close draw to Northern CC, falling short by 3 runs- made for a frustrating end quarter of the season. With even fears of a relegation ourselves and only ourselves to blame.

Tensions did get tight around the club which was expected due to our performances. But I praise the guys in still showing their faces down at the club after these low periods during the season, enduring the well deserved 'spray'/advice from our passionate supporters. The cliché 'its an easy game

when you're winning' is spot on. No doubt about that. But it's how you handle when things aren't going your way, that's really shows your character. And for our boys, I couldn't be prouder in the way you just kept going.

Players to look out for this coming season are young Jack Saunders and Taylor Cornall. Two best mates playing in the Liverpool Premier League together at such a young age who produced solid performances in their first full season in the prem.

Personally, Thank you, Thank you for the mind blank that Lytham CC had every year when the decision was made to keep asking me back. I've spent 6 great seasons at Lytham. Highlights being the 2010 premiership and the people that I have met that I now call friends for life. To where it all started with Mully and Knighto back in 2010, to the Changing of Guard with the young crew that are rolling through now (pests), I now have very fond memories of my whole experience because of you. Thank you Beefy and the wonderful Claire for taking me on board. I'm frequently asked back home here in Aus if I miss it. My straight answer is 'I miss my mates - not necessarily the weather".

Lytham 3rd team opened the 2016 season with a strong feeling of optimism after narrowly missing out on being league champions on a technical interpretation of the points allocation the year before.



favour. A special mention to Myles Child who took a hat-trick in the penultimate over of the game.

Throughout the season Lytham were undefeated in their matches including their group matches where they saw off the likes of Fulwood and Broughton, Kirkham and Wesham and Longridge. In the quarter final of the Palace Shield Rose Trophy, Lytham were drawn against St.Annes which was always going to be a tough game, but Lytham batted and bowled really well to secure the win.

For the 2016 season our aim was for inclusive competitive club cricket with focus on the lads enjoying the game. The squad formed an effective team, under the capable captaincy of Callum Doyle, they played 11 matches, winning 8

Thanks to all the parents and Len Hackett who umpired most of the games and to the players from the lower age groups who played for the U15s, particularly to Harrison Child and Alex Higham of U14 who played in every match.

The U15 came second in the league winning 6 out of total of 8 matches. In the representative knock out county cup they won 1 against Roe Green and narrowly lost to Euxton who went on to win the county competition. There was 1 friendly where they destroyed Preston.

We have had some explosive batting this season and some measured batting to create some excellent scores and run chases. Our bowling was on the whole very efficient but didn't always take the opportunities that came to us due to the fielding and some of the bowlers would have had better figures had the catches gone or stayed in hand! Catches win matches and that is one area of our game we are looking to improve upon next year.

First of all, thanks to the parents who help out each week at training and during games.

Thanks also to the parents who help off the pitch and to all who have been supportive in making their boys available sometimes at short notice and I'm sure that meant rearranging plans, it is appreciated.

Weather wise it has been atrocious, in hindsight the snow game against Blackpool was good weather in comparison to some of the ill timed rain we had. However, we played all our games in a spirit that was commended by a number of opposition coaches and umpires. In a higher age group the boys did well to win 3 games and were close to winning others, putting in good performances in each game.

I started playing cricket 30 years agothe summer of 2016 was the first in which I have been involved in a game where it snowed. I was stood umpiring, in my 6 tops, thermal long johns, hat and gloves, thinking, "It's snowing" and "thank god we fielded first!" Thankfully the sun won the day and so did Lytham by one wicket!!

We made a decision at the start of this summer that the U12B team might be better served in the Plate competition of the u13s. This would allow boys in the U12A team to get more cricket as we moved from pairs and not everyone was guaranteed a bat and bowl. It would also enable us to give game time for some U13 boys who weren't getting much A team action and who didn't have a B team to play in. All in all that has worked well.

Due to the decision we made about the team we have had a lot of players turning out across the 8 games, 22 in total. Thanks to all those boys from the U11s, U12s and U13s. Once again this summer there has been a lot of improvement. In particular, the team batted well in most games, with some good individual performances not only in terms of run scoring, but also seeing games over the finishing line. As a bowling unit, the boys did not take as many wickets as we would've liked, but there was some good economical bowling in a number of games.

All the children progressed immensely throughout the season, and towards the end they were all participating fully in mini matches during training.

Whilst trying to make the sessions fun for all involved, cricket is also a sport that requires a lot of discipline and patience. The assist with this a 'Kwik of the Week' trophy was awarded to the child who the collective coaches felt had performed well during that training session, not only in demonstrating cricket related skills, but also in general behaviour and attitude. This quickly

become a sought after award, and it was encouraging to see that everyone really wanted to listen, train hard and improve in order to try and win the trophy.





So here I am, in my plane seat ready to embark on my mammoth journey back home to the other side of the world. A perfect opportunity to sit back and reflect on what I would regard as the best three months of my life.

Ever since I started playing cricket at a young age, I have always dreamed of making the trip over to Australia to play a season out there and finally, at the age of 23, the opportunity arose. It all began when I had finished my first professional season for Lancashire last September and clubs in Sydney invited me over to play for them. North Sydney cricket club came forward with the generous offer of paying for my flights as well as accommodation in a perfectly positioned apartment - I couldn't wait to start the next chapter in my life.

I was quite anxious on my flight over as I would be joining a team of people I didn't know with the weight of expectations on my shoulders. However, I was met at the airport by one of the lads at the club who drove me to my apartment. The journey there took us over Harbour Bridge with a really awesome view of the Opera House, not a bad start to my new way of life for the next few months. After a good first week of training and meeting everyone at the club, it was time to put on my whites and represent North Sydney for the first time. It was a tough first game for me, adjusting to the conditions and temperature was a major hill for me to climb, alongside the fact that it is notoriously hard for bowlers to take wickets in Australia. I went wicketless in my first game but took a lot away from the experience. The following weekend we were chasing 450 in 75 overs, this really did open my eyes as to how differently cricket is played in the Southern Hemisphere. At that



point, I think I realised how challenging it may possibly be over there as a fast bowler. After settling into the team environment and finally overcoming the jet lag, I found myself beginning to perform for the team. I began to believe that I could fulfil the expectations that come with being a club's overseas pro.

The weeks just flew by and before I knew it Christmas was around the corner. Being a devout lover of family time at Christmas, I knew this was going to be my first struggle, being on the other side of the world to my brothers and parents. Fortunately I was invited by a player at the club to join his family for a festive dinner followed by a day on the beach - something I struggled to get my head around!



Before I knew it February had arrived, I couldn't believe that my adventure was almost at an end. Luckily North Sydney had already invited me back for their next season which was just incredible. My parents arrived, I was scheduled to play the next day and they couldn't wait to come and watch. Then something happened that I would never have thought possible in Australia, the game was called off due to the weather forecast suggesting that the temperature would reach highs of 45 degrees! The cricket association agreed that it would be too dangerous to play. I couldn't believe it and my parents were even more surprised having just flown from rainy England expecting to see some cricket in the sunshine. They had spent the previous weeks staying up all night following the matches live online and were looking forward to watching in daylight hours. The more I think about my time in Oz, I genuinely could not recommend a better place for any aspiring cricketers to make the trip overseas to experience the Australian way of life whilst challenging yourself in unfamiliar cricket conditions.

I will hopefully being doing this for many more years to come! It was by far the best time of my life so far. But for now it's time for me to focus on my English season here in this freezing British weather!







Voices from the past ...

Some say there's no point dwelling in the past, but sometimes having a look at what has gone on before is really interesting.

Last year, whilst co-incidentally trying to find out exactly when the Club was founded, I received an email out of the blue from a local man called Nick Moore.

The message contained an article from the weekly paper. The Preston Guardian, dated 24th August 1844. It was in the sports column reporting on a cricket match held on the previous week.

The details (shortened slightly) below appear to report the first ever sports activity on the ground. The event predates the previously believed foundation date of 1855 by some eleven years.

Of course, it may be that the Club didn't have a 'physical' base or Club House until 1855 – as the article hints that nothing existed at Church Road at the time.

Or we could assume the founding of the Club began when the first team sport was played in our name – in which case we need to re-write our history - and change our date to 1844.

A fascinating discussion ensued between long-time members David Holgate, William Huxham and Tony Hale as to what it all means, as they too assumed 1855 was the year everything started (affirmed by their recollection of the Club's 150th anniversary in 2005).

I have checked and the match was definitely played at Church Road.

The article also points to a start date for the Club as the last week in July 1844!

Until we know more, read on and form your own opinion. It's an interesting article nonetheless....

Preston Guardian – 24th August, 1844

"CRICKET – A match between first XI the Lytham Cricket Club and the first XI of the Kirkham Club was played at Lytham on Wednesday last.

Notwithstanding the very unfavourable state of the weather, a large number of spectators were present... John Talbot Clifton Esq. and his lady, also honoured the party with their presence.

After some excellent bowling by Messrs, Miles and Clarkson, Kirkham retired with a score of 37. The gentlemen of the Lytham Club then went in, with light hearts, for they had fully expected the Kirkham gentlemen scoring 60 or 70....

With what consternation and surprise did they behold the wickets of one member after another fall, by the superior bowling of Messrs. Park and Brown. ... with very few, if any notches, the Lythamites retired with only a score of 8.

Which was certainly far from creditable to their skill, but it is worthy of remark that the Lytham Club had not been formed five weeks and about five of the players never handled a bat before.

The umpires (Messrs, Mills and Brown) then agreed that Lytham should take to the bat. For they thought that the Kirkham gentlemen would have no occasion to go in again!

But the Lythamites were a little more careful of their wickets than before, scoring 52,

Thus requiring Kirkham to get 24...the game now appeared to favour the Lytham Club......but Kirkham's superior batting was not to be overcome....and they won the game, having two wickets to go down. Kirkham retired with a score of 30, thus winning by seven runs.

The utmost harmony and good feeling prevailed during the whole game, not a single dispute arising. A tent was erected on the ground, for the accommodation of the spectators. Wickets pitched at two. The game finished at half six, lasting some four hours and a half."


